INTRODUCTION

July 2020 Royton Shaw and Crompton Update

GOOD NEWS

- The Royton, Shaw and Crompton Neighbourhood Team continue working in partnership with our X border colleagues in Rochdale. A 15 year old male has been charged with Burglary, Theft of motor vehicle, 2 x attempt theft from motor vehicle and 1 x theft from motor vehicle. On the 20th July he was in court to plead guilty to the offences and is due to appear in court again on 9th September for sentencing. In addition there are 9 impending prosecutions for similar offences. We would like to thank the victims, witnesses and residents for their patience and support in bringing this male to justice.
- On 13/07/2020 Cannabis farm in Royton- 110 Plants seized - 1 x male brought in for questioning
- On 08/07/2020 a vehicle was stopped by the Neighbourhood Team on Tandle Hill's car park. 1 x male was arrested for possession of Class A drugs and believed to be in a stolen vehicle on false plates. Initial enquiries resulted in a significant quantity of what is suspected to be an illegal substance being seized from the home address. Investigation on-going.
- On 07/07/20 - Vehicle stopped on Spring Garden Street Royton, three males on board. Two were found in possession of cannabis and issued with a street warning

Act now to avoid a local lockdown

To help halt the spread of Coronavirus, save lives and prevent a local lockdown, we need all Oldham residents and businesses to follow our new guidance.

You need to act **NOW**. If everyone makes these small changes we can avoid a second lockdown - but there is no time to lose.

REMEMBER: the best way to stop the spread of the virus is to limit those who you have contact with – spend time with those in your household and work from home where possible. **DO NOT** have visitors to your home or garden.

If you must meet people from outside your household do so in an outdoor location, maintain social distancing and avoid physical contact.

When visiting shops, when on public transport or in other enclosed or crowded spaces you should wear a mask.

You must not:

- Meet people you do not live with inside a private home or garden, except where you have formed a [support bubble](#) (or for other limited exemptions).
- Visit someone else's home or garden even if they live outside of the affected areas.
- Socialise with people you do not live with in other indoor public venues – such as pubs, restaurants, cafes, shops, places of worship, community centres, leisure and entertainment venues, or visitor attractions. You may attend these venues with people you live with (or are in a [support bubble](#) with), but should avoid interaction with others.
- If you run one of these venues, you should ensure people maintain social distancing and avoid physical contact, in line with [COVID-19 Secure guidance](#) - GOV.UK website.
- We are advising any residents who have recently shielded to continue taking extra care now that the shielding process has formally ended in Oldham. - [Guidance on shielding and protecting people who are clinically extremely vulnerable from COVID-19](#) - GOV.UK website

SCAMS

BOGUS OFFICIAL WARNING

- Householders are being asked to stay alert after reports of a bogus caller in the Shaw area. A man has been reported to GMP after approaching an elderly resident claiming that they are from a Utility company and have installed their Smart Meter in the past and now have come round to take the fake £200.00 maintenance or installation fee. Direct Debit information was also asked for. Please look out for your elderly neighbours by informing them not to engage with a man or males claiming they have installed their Smart Meter in the past. - On the 28.07.2020 in Shaw a warden controlled property was approached by a white male approx. 5'4, 25-30 years old, sandy coloured hair, clean shaven, wearing a grey jacket and pants. The male claimed to be there to carry out repairs to the bathroom. The male has shown no ID to the elderly resident and as the resident explained to him that no fault had been reported, the male tried to force the door open. Luckily this resident had a chain... in place which prevented the door from being opened.

Please pass this on, especially if you have relatives living in accommodation where repairs are carried out by the housing provider. You should always have had notice of any works needing to be carried out and any legitimate workmen should be carrying ID which can be verified.
